

How to sort your waste at ITU



Food waste is converted into biogas and fertilizer.

Food waste - raw as well as cooked - meat, fish, fruits and vegetables, nuts, coffee grounds and filters, teabags.

Sorted in the student kitchens



Paper is recycled into new products.

Newsprint and magazines, advertising materials, envelopes, books, writing- and drawing paper.

No need to remove clips or tape.

Sorted in the printing rooms



Cardboard is recycled into new products.

Cardboard boxes, corrugated cardboard, cartons.

Cardboard must be dry.

Sorted in 0C02



Soft and rigid plastics and cartons from food and beverages are recycled into new products.

Plastic bottles without refund, bottles used for beverages, plastic bags, plastic wrap, milk and juice cartons, coffee milk-bricks.

Empty packaging and cartons as well as you can.

Sorted in the student kitchens



Hazardous waste - for treatment under controlled conditions.

Chemicals and poisons, spray cans etc.

Products and empty containers marked with hazard pictograms are hazardous waste.

Sorted in 0C02



Batteries are collected separately for special recycling.

All types of small batteries from everyday devices, such as remotes, computers, controllers and other electronics.

Sorted in 0C02



Metal is recycled into new products.

Metal containers without refund, tins and cans, utensils and foil.

Empty containers as well as you can.

Sorted in the student kitchens



Glass and jars are refilled or turned into new jars.

Wine and liquor bottles, food jars etc.

Empty jars and bottles as well as you can.

Sorted in 0C02



Residual waste is converted into electricity and district heating.

Hand towels, hygiene waste, pizza boxes, styrofoam.

Sorted in the student kitchens



Electronic waste is recycled into new products.

Anything with batteries or wires. Phones, chargers, computer equipment.

Batteries must be sorted by themselves.

Sorted in 0C02



Textile waste is recycled into new materials.

Textiles that are worn out, stained or torn.

Textile must be clean and dry.

Sorted in 0C02



Porcelain and china are sent for safe disposal.

Broken porcelain - cups, plates, dishes etc.

Broken porcelain and ceramics must not be placed in the glass container.

Sorted in 0C02



Refundable bottles and cans are refunded through the Danish deposit and return system.

Empty bottles and cans with a Danish deposit symbol (pant).
