Study Programme Report – DIM

- DIM's scores are looking good.
- Action Plan 2024:
 - No big projects
 - Make sure the exam formats and specifics around this are simple and understandable for both teachers/supervisors and students.
 - Continued discussion of the use of GAI. Especially concerning the written exams.
 - In Computational Literacies the course manager has collected a big amount of data with the use of Generative AI and DIM's Heads of Study Programme hope SAP will use this in the development of guidelines and regulations around Generative AI.
 - Update specialisations, by request of the Employers Panel.
 Big Data Processes: an update of courses and the connection between the courses in the specialisation.
 - Global Competence Description will be updated according to contemporary subjects and goals.
 - Issues of overlap between GBI and DIM will continue to be discussed.

- The data in the report is for graduates from 2019 and it is very limited, since we have a low response rate.
- DIM's numbers are looking good.
- Primary skills that the DIM students have taken with them in their first job after finishing their studies: Critical thinking, IT skills, new knowledge, and analytical skills.
