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Your stay abroad

What was it like to study at ECE Paris (including choice of courses, academic level, social life at campus)?

It was a good experience with a high academic level. The program that I had was well structured and you saw the point with the program from start to finish. In Paris it is mandatory to come to class, and you are getting crossed off when attending, to much absent equals that you do not get your transcript. ECE Paris is an engineering school, which is proud of their academic level and their learning methods. It is not common to have homework, so although I was in school from 9-17 everyday (Monday – Thursday), it was nice to have the opportunity to go around in the streets of Paris without stressing over being prepared for the next day. Assignments was made in class, where time was allocated. The social program could be better but every Friday there were mandatory social activities which were museum visits, planned boat trip etc. Since it was summer school everyone in the class was on exchange, which meant that most talked together and hungout after classes. Lunch was allocated, so you could go and sit by the Eiffel tower and enjoy a good glass of wine and a croissant.

What was your initial motivation for going abroad and did your stay meet your expectations?

The biggest motivation was to come out and live and experience another culture and meeting new people. I see this as a nice opportunity when you are studying in another country, because the other students are also interested in the same thing and then you have some strangers to experience it with. It's also healthy to come out of your comfort zone, and even though it can feel frightening to imagine going by yourself, it is an amazing feeling to see what lays in front of you. The trip did without a doubt live up to my expectations. Amazing place, amazing people and amazing culture.

Please describe what you got out of your stay, both personally and academically, and how do you expect it to contribute to your further studies?

I can really feel that my English (and French) has improved because you are forced to communicate in another language than your native. The trip has also given me a good understanding of the French culture and how they work, which have made me consider going back sometime in the future. Academically it has strengthened my CV and shown me that AVR is part of the future and really something that would be an interesting future career.
