What was it like to study at the university (including choice of courses, academic level, social life at campus)?

The atmosphere at Reykjavik University (RU) is really relaxed. More so than at ITU. RU does not believe that every single course needs an exam or a fixed number of assignments, it is only up to the professor, who will decide on the academic form for each of the courses. This means that they vary quite a lot in both expectations and workload, but ultimatel, y it follows the ideal of spending the most time on what you think is interesting.

Recommendations

There aren't a lot of exchange students at RU, especially from the Nordic countries, so meeting some from the University of Iceland (the biggest university in Iceland) could be a nice thing.
